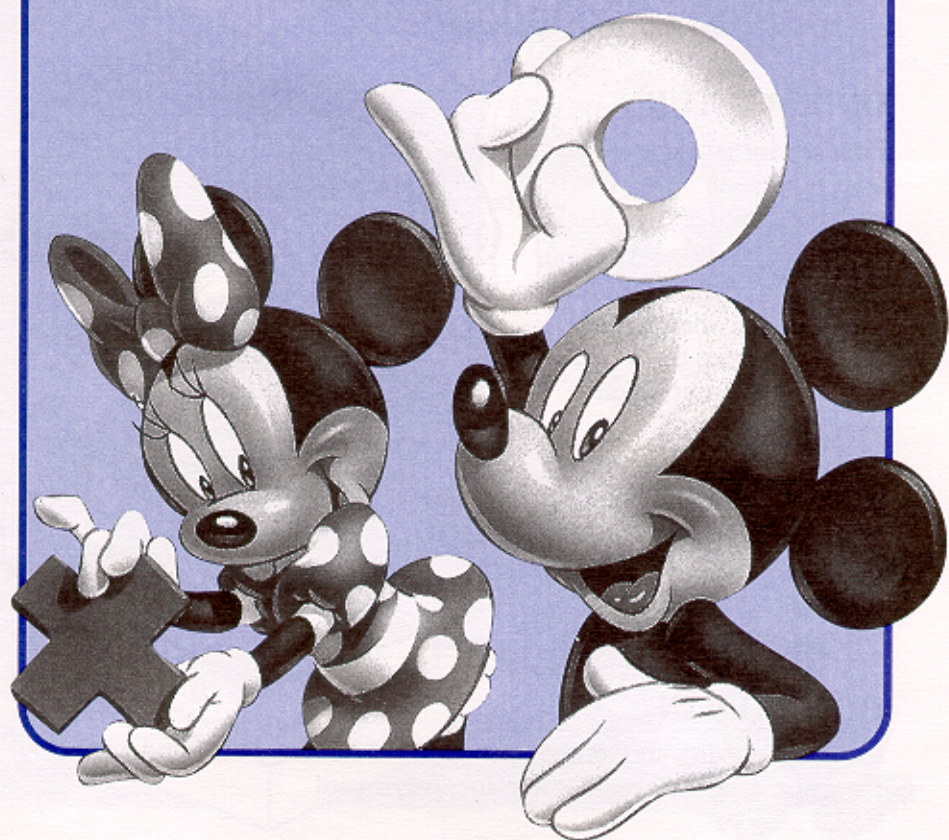




# 3-D Tic Tac Toe

2 Players

# Beginner Game

## OBJECT

Be the first player to line up 3 of your Disney pawns in a row on the stair spaces!

## SETUP

1. Choose your 6 pawns, either the blue **X** pawns or the yellow **O** pawns. Your opponent takes the remaining 6 pawns.
2. For the Beginner Game, make sure the stairs are attached to the platform as shown in Step 5 of the Assembly Instructions. There are 9 Stair spaces in this game. The 3 Stair spaces on the platform should be *behind* the stairs.

## HOW TO PLAY

The younger player goes first. Play then continues by alternating turns with your opponent.

## ON YOUR TURN

Place one of your pawns on any empty Stair space. This ends your turn.

Your object is to get 3 of your pawns in a row – up and down, across or diagonally. That's Tic Tac Toe! See the 3 Tic Tac Toe examples on the opposite page.

You must place your pawns to prevent your opponent from getting Tic Tac Toe! See Figure 1 for an example of this strategy.

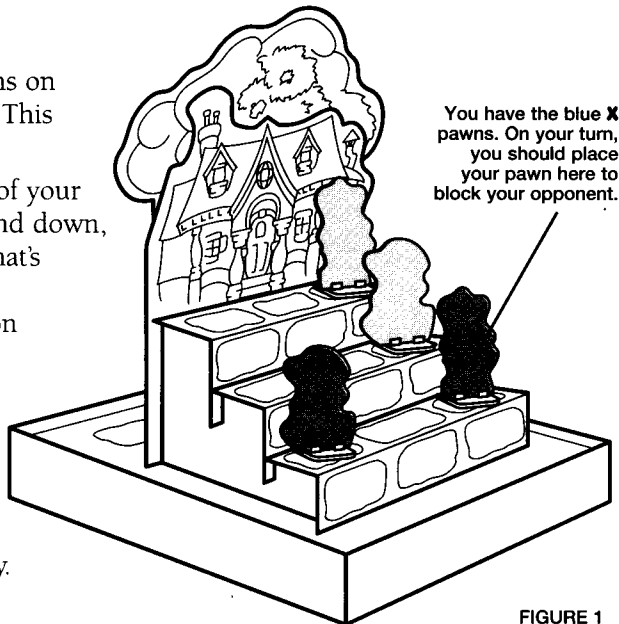


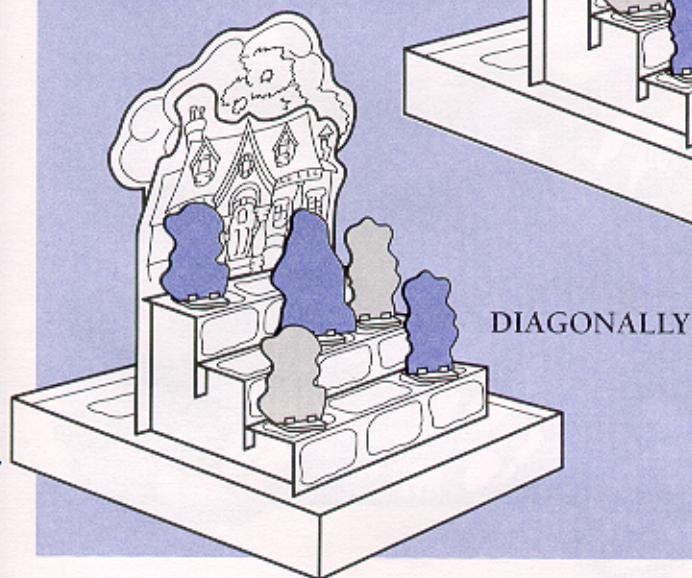
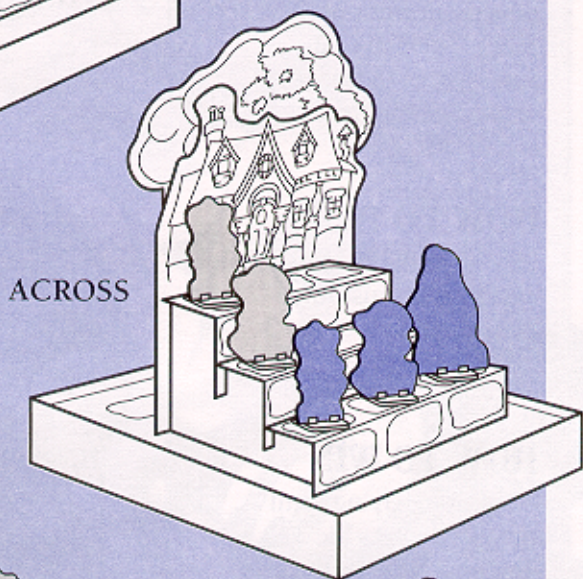
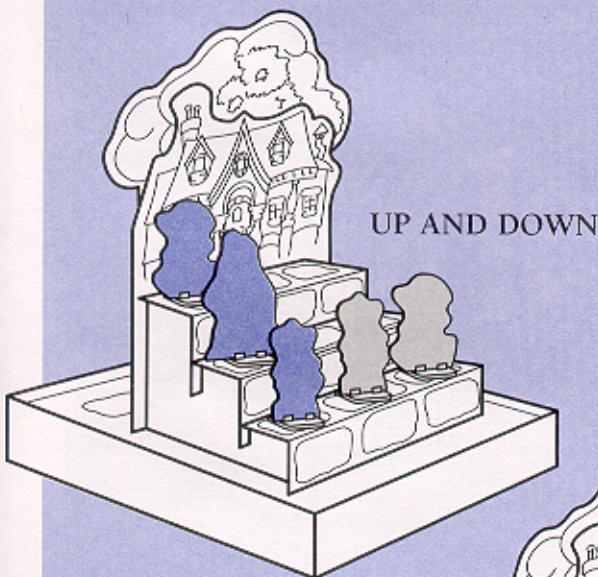

## HOW TO WIN

Continue playing until one player shouts "TIC TAC TOE!" and wins the game. If no one gets Tic Tac Toe, play again!

## TIC TAC TOE EXAMPLES

In each example below, the player with the blue X pawns has Tic Tac Toe!



# Advanced Game

## OBJECT

Force your opponent to get Tic Tac Toe!

## SETUP

1. Choose your 6 pawns as in the Beginner Game Setup.
2. To make the game more challenging, use the extra Stair spaces on the platform. Remove the gameboard from the platform and re-insert it so that the 3 Stair spaces are directly in front of the stairs. There are 12 Stair spaces in this game. See Figure 2.

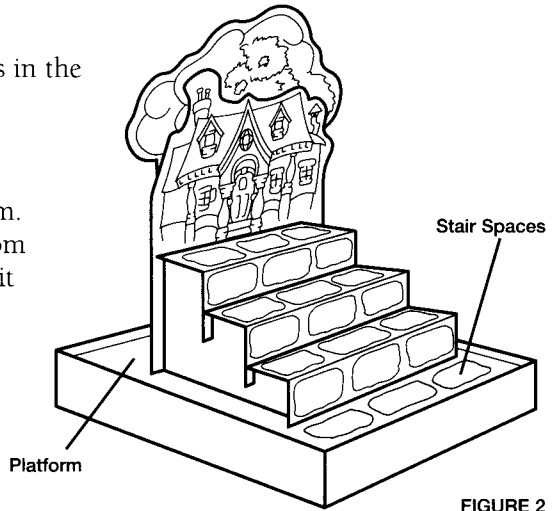

## HOW TO PLAY

Play as in the Beginner Game, except you must force your opponent to get 3 in a row.

## HOW TO WIN

Continue playing until one player gets Tic Tac Toe. If you're *not* the one who gets Tic Tac Toe, you win! See Figure 3 for an example.

If no one gets Tic Tac Toe, play again!

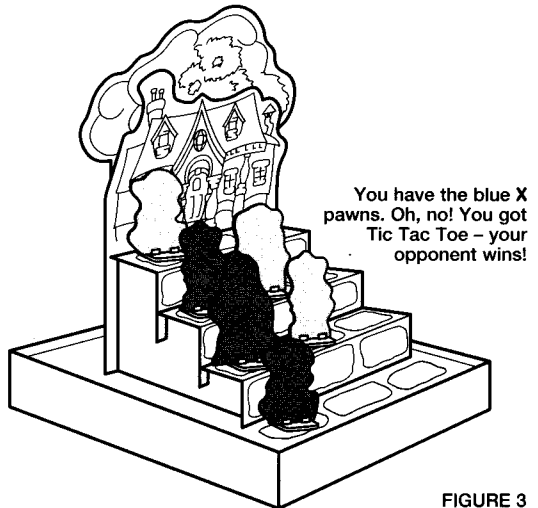
